5. Where and when have you heard a "bold and shocking opinion"?
6. Read John 13:34-35. What does it say marks us as a Christian? (**Love**)
7. We have been commanded to love. How are you being obedient to this command even when you don't agree with someone?
8. Who is hard for you to love? How can we manage to love those hard to love?
(I Thessalonians 3:12—"May the Lord make your love increase and overflow for each other and for everyone else, just as our does for you.)
9. How can we love one another in a bold, shocking way? What would that look like?
10. Ted talked about "resume virtues" and "eulogy virtues." What's the difference? What would be on your resume? What is one thing you'd like to have said in your eulogy?
11. Do you agree with Bob Goff: "Most people need love and acceptance more than advice." Why or why not?
12. Romans 13:10 says that "love is the fulfillment of the law." How can that be? What are the implications of that?
13. Do you speak words of value over people in your life? What are some examples?
14. Who do you know that could use a "love shower," represented in the shower of confetti we saw in Sunday's service?
