(**They can be a minister to others, armed with what they learn in sermons that will apply to others.**) (**Plus in some cases, they can prepare for when they might be in that situation.**)
6. What were five things Ted said the Proverbs 31 woman was besides a wife? (**mother, businesswoman, investor, farmer, manufacturer**). What are three things you’d say you are?
7. What were the seven “thank you’s” Ted pulled from Proverbs 31? (**For enjoying our home, for starting your day early, for ending your day late, for opening our home to others, for speaking words of high value over her husband, for picturing a special future for her family, for teaching us.**) Which of the seven “Thank You’s” would your children or husband pick first?
8. Does your husband support your gifts and talents? In what way?
9. Do you enjoy working around your home?
10. What was breakfast like when you were a child? What is it like now?
11. Are you someone who thinks about and prepares for the future? What concerned you most earlier in your life and what concerns you most now?
12. What is one of the most important things your mom taught you? What is one of the most important things you have taught your children?
