Killing Cancel Culture with Kindness
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What is your natural reaction to the idea of cancel culture?

Proverbs 18:21 says that the tongue has the power of life and death. What is the intent of cancel culture? Why is this a problem?

Read Colossians 2:13-15

The Bible speaks of sin in terms of debt. When someone sins against us it is natural to demand that they must pay for the harm they have caused. How are we as Christians called to respond when someone sins against us? Why is the way we respond so important for us and for the person who has sinned?

Matthew 18:23-35

This parable is trying to teach us a principle about the kingdom of heaven. What is the overall lesson of this parable? What is the lesson for each character in the story? Which character do you personally identify with the most?

Matthew 6:12 reminds us that we are not called to be debt collectors. The gospel calls us to be redemptive voices to that which is broken. What does that look like in our personal lives? How does it apply to issues in our society and world?

Colossians 4:5-6

How hard is it for you to be patient and allow God to deal with someone's sin instead of taking control yourself? What is at stake if we take things into our own hands?

Proverbs 17:27-28

We are not expected to sit silently in the presence of sin, but how we respond matters. How does this scripture guide us to speak up on important matters? How can you speak life into a difficult situation this week?
