Read Deuteronomy 6:5-7, 2 Timothy 1:5, 2 Timothy 3:14-15 and Matthew 10:34-37

What do these scriptures have to teach us about the influence of parents and grandparents on the younger generations, especially in the area of faith?

Ted said, "I never want my relationship with my children to get in the way of their relationship with Jesus." In what ways can a difficult parent/child relationship keep a child from growing in (or beginning) their relationship with Jesus?

Jim Burns encouraged parents to "Keep the welcome mat out and your mouth shut." Do you agree with this advice? How hard is it for you to follow?

End your time together praying for wisdom to know when and how to speak up in our family relationships. May we use our influence in a way that brings our families closer to each other and ultimately closer to Christ.
